Ottawa-Petawawa 2009

On May 7-8, 2009, about 20 commissionaires and 20 CFB Petawawa military personnel will run, in pairs and sometimes as a group, in relay-style formation for a total of 200 km from Parliament Hill (starting point) in Ottawa along Old Highway 17 West to CFB Petawawa (finish line). To acknowledge gathered supporters, donors, veterans and military families along the way, the running convoy will make brief stops over the course of two days at the following assembly points: Parliament Hill (starting point), Kanata, Carp, Kinburn, Arnprior, Renfrew, the Township of McNab/Braeside, the Township of Whitewater Region, Pembroke, and through to the finish line at the Red Friday Welcome Home Troops Rally in Petawawa.
